## MEETING NOTES

- Call to order; read rules and conduct of the meeting – Chair
  - Chair called the meeting to order at 10:11AM
- Roll Call – Chair

- Round Table Discussion
  - Chair will be present and act as a facilitator for each Round Table while a Panel member from each region acts as an ambassador and provides opening and closing comments and introduces the CRP prior to the substantive questions being asked.
  - Possibility of adding questions around what wellness looks like to OCS staff and if they could disrupt or rebuild the OCS system to enhance worker wellness and better serve children and families, what would that look like?
  - Important to communicate with OCS staff ahead of time to ensure that they know that what is discussed in the Round Tables will not be attributed to them individually in any meeting notes or reports.

- 2022 Workplan Status
  - Coordinator shared a review of where the Panel is at in terms of the 2022 Workplan.
  - Possibility of working with tribal organizations directly by introducing the CRP to them and offering what the Panel can help them with. Sharon Sparks listed two contacts that can be contacted to start this process. Tracy McGary, Co-Chair Tribal State and Lola Tobuk, Tribal State.
  - Sharon attended the national CRP Conference and shared that CRPs around the nation are experiencing the same issues with Social Workers burning out as well as Foster Parents. They used to be on Panels however they are becoming too busy and as such are leaving their local CRPs. Sharon also added that other CRPs have a mentorship program to bring newer members up to speed.

  - Malan Paquette, Anchor Point – Advocate and offering anti-fraud and victims’ rights resources to be distributed through Alaska in office spaces. She highlighted a conflict with the Criminal Justice Commission DV Workgroup.
